## CELEBRATING SUCCESSES, RECOGNIZING CHALLENGES

I hat better way to wrap up another academic year for Gamma Chapter than to appreciate where things stand for our chapter and alumni. Let's celebrate the following:

- The chapter GPA remains at 3.35 or higher, with a record from the new member class of 3.51 (across 31 members).
- We've seen continued improvement in the responses from new members regarding participation in the Aspire program. The growth and feedback gained from this class are essential to further develop Aspire.
- We have a new active executive team working to further develop Gamma Chapter's rich history by listening to and addressing concerns from the all-house survey while making sure the fraternity's rules are respected and followed.

What is the focus of the Alumni Board heading into summer? The following items top the list:

- · Assisting the recruitment chairmen in securing a high-quality new member class. This is the lifeblood of our fraternity.
- Aspiring to lead via continued mentoring of the active executive team, which began with a productive active executive/Alumni Board retreat in February 2024 and continues with regular contact from the board.
- · Developing life and career aspirations for

second-, third-, and fourth-year members that cover topics such as résumé review, interviewing techniques, social media training, financial planning, involvement opportunities, and development of conflict -resolution skills.

#### **LOOKING AHEAD**

We celebrate these achievements and plan to further develop members while addressing challenges. One continued challenge to UNL's Greek system is the inclination of seniors applying for out-of-house status and an alarming number of juniors too. There are several reasons given (cheaper to live in an apartment/rented house, wanting a different living style, the ability to have a beer where they live/ sleep, etc.), but the trend keeps growing.

For the 2024-25 academic year, there will be two seniors living in the fraternity, and nine juniors have requested and been granted out-of-house status. Some will argue that it helps build a larger chapter (currently at 104 members). While this is true, it undoubtedly creates a leadership "vacuum" within the walls of the fraternity and requires continued large new member classes (28 to 32).

While the desire to move out seems foreign to many of us, it appears to be a sign of the times. We repeat to the members: "You can live in an apartment the rest of your life, but you only have four years to live in a fraternity with your brothers.'

We appreciate the alumni who attended a Monday night dinner and meeting this past academic year to share their AGS and college experiences while answering career questions. Don't hesitate to reach out with questions you might have, including any interest in serving on either board or addressing the chapter during a Monday night dinner and meeting. Look for additional communications this year and beyond as the Foundation Board works to raise funds to carry out our missions. Put Saturday, September 7, in your calendars, as the alumni and foundation will host the Big Red Tailgate prior to the game against Colorado. The Alumni Association will host the annual meeting before that event, so stay tuned for details. Also mark Thursday, November 7 2024 for our inaugural Give to Gamma Day. More to come on this special day for Gamma Chapter's past, present and future.

Reflecting on his journey, Todd offers some advice to current undergraduates. "Use your education as a foundation so that you can pursue a career that fits your lifestyle and passion," he said. "And be sure to remember your wife on Valentine's Day!"

Today, Todd lives in O'Neill and farms north of Atkinson. He and his wife, a former house sweetheart, enjoy skiing, traveling, and relaxing at their cabin in Hidden Paradise.
